I also had a lot of free time between subjects, and this time I spent on traveling in Lithuania or in another countries.

It was very sad to leave Lithuania. I had a lot of new friends from different countries and now we have already agreed when we go back to Lithuania again. I have only the most pleasant memories and I am really glad that Erasmus was in my life.
